### 3. What does becoming a prequalified General Contractor (GC) with the PBC mean?

Becoming a prequalified General Contractor (GC) with the PBC means demonstrating your financial capacity to complete a project (by providing contact names of your subcontractors, your surety, etc.) along with your bid.

### 4. I only hold a trade contractor license (plumbing, electrical, HVAC etc.). Can I still be prequalified by the PBC?

At this time, the PBC is only prequalifying General Contractors. However, you can demonstrate your ability to complete a project by providing contact names of your subcontractors, your surety, etc.) along with your bid.

### 5. I need help putting together my response. What should I do?

Using the information provided in the RFP, you are required to demonstrate current bonding capacity?

Yes. Your bid must include a bond from a surety company.

### 11. My company does not have a Safety Program Manual, what should I submit to explain my company's approach to performing construction safely?

If your company does not have a Safety Program Manual, you should submit a written statement explaining your company's approach to performing construction safely.
